Indiana FFA recognizes Distinguished Service Award Recipients

Two members of the agriculture education community tabbed for exceptional service to Indiana FFA.

West Lafayette, IN (June 21, 2023) – Indiana FFA recognized two people for their dedication to agriculture education and FFA at the 94th Indiana FFA State Convention on Wednesday. Blake Hackman and Dr. Allen Talbert were recognized.

Mr. Blake Hackman has continually made strides in improving agriculture and agriculture education across Indiana. Throughout his 35 + years of teaching in Indiana, Mr. Hackman has proven his dedication to the future of agriculture education in Indiana, by consistently opening up his classroom to student teachers, allowing them to gain experience and learn from his wealth of knowledge. He has also provided thousands of students with unique opportunities, now producing 2 state officers, and countless section directors and district officers. Likewise, Mr. Hackman has remained persistent in maintaining and upgrading the Indiana FFA Leadership Center grounds each year. Under his direction, the Brownstown Central FFA Chapter has been responsible for building the Robert Myers Memorial Flag Deck, the purchase and placement of the Covered Bridge, and the renewal of the FFA bushes that are seen across the lake. From the Leadership Center alone, one can see the enormous impact Mr. Hackman has made in these respective areas. He has received numerous awards and recognitions from NAAE and IAAE for his commitment to better those around him, even earning the Honorary American Degree for his continued dedication to National FFA.
