As a part of a strategic initiative to better align the inffa.org portal for Indiana FFA, a waiver feature has now been integrated into the advisor portal. All students participating in Indiana FFA Programs (CDEs, LDEs, Conferences, Conventions, Events, etc) will need to have a completed waiver, with parent/guardian signature, before they can be registered for an event.

One (1) Day Convention Parking Pass = \$6.00

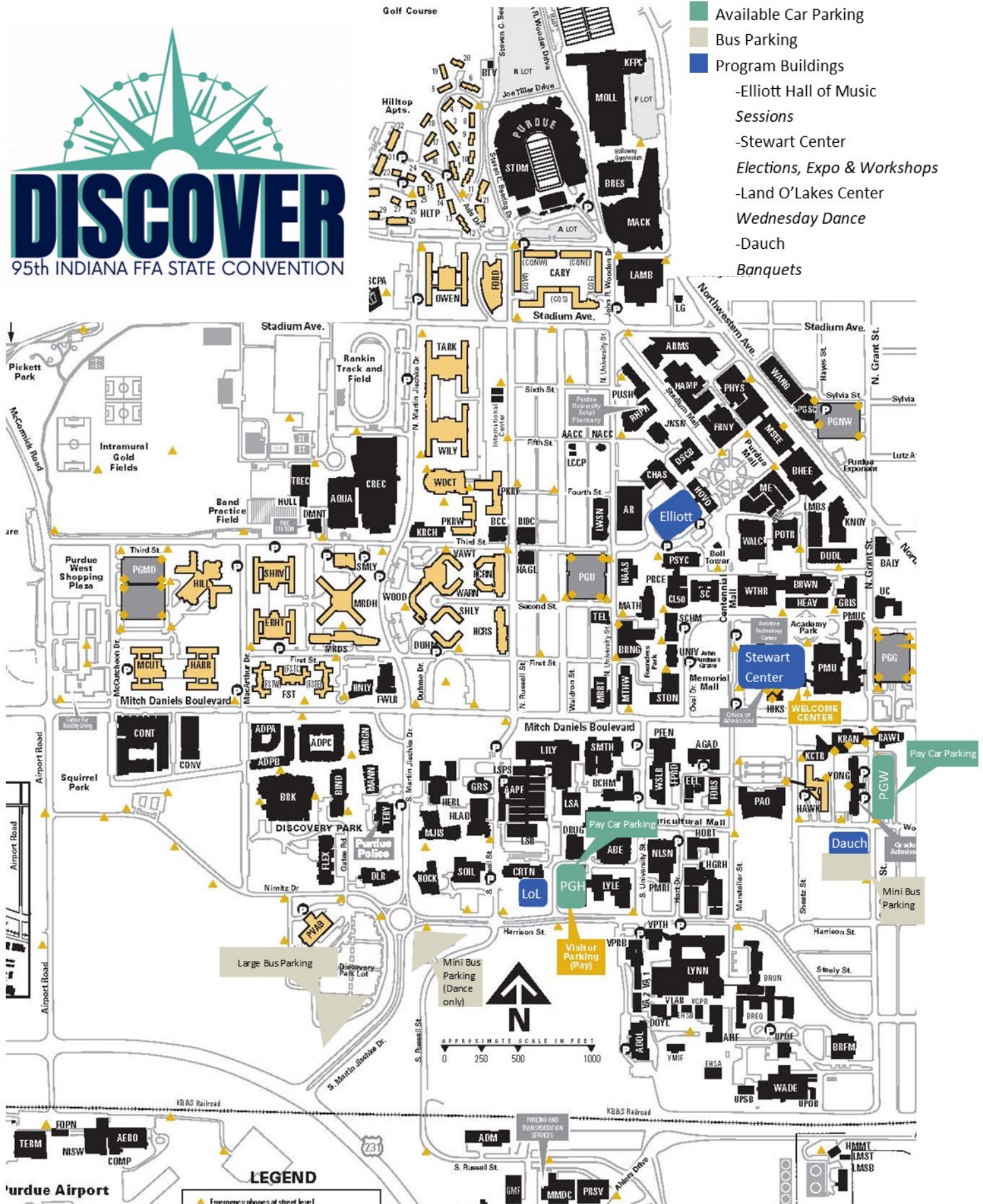
