








The Indiana FFA Association's membership saw another record breaking year! Our membership grew from 10,084 to 11,067 members. We are very excited that the increased number members means we are able to offer our FFA programming to more students across Indiana. This will allow us continue to pursue our mission of growing leaders, building communities, and strengthen agriculture. We appreciate the hard work of our FFA advisors and agricultural educators in our 192 FFA chapters.

During the year we had 30 FFA chapters who chose to become Affiliate FFA Chapters, where every single student who was in an agriculture education class was an FFA member. This allows a chapter to have 100% membership and makes us truly intra-

curricular. It increases membership and participation in those chapters, while also providing a lower cost per member. We hope to see our number of Affiliate programs grow to at least 35 in this next membership year.

For the 2015-2016 year we hope to see membership rise to 11,500. Our long term goal is to see an, all time, record high of 12,000 FFA members by 2017. With an increase in Affiliate Chapters and the continued work of our motivating FFA Advisors, we are confident we will continue to grow our membership to record levels.

INDIANA SOYBEAN, CORN FARMERS TEAM UP WITH INDIANA FFA AND THE COLTS TO PACK MEALS FOR THE HUNGRY





Members of the Indiana FFA joined Indiana corn and soybean farmers, Indianapolis Colts players and thousands of volunteers November 18 to pack a million meals for food banks across Indiana. Chapter members also brought home meals to be distributed in the local community. As part of their "Community Tuesday" program, the Indianapolis Colts teamed up with the Indiana Corn Marketing Council (ICMC) and Indiana Soybean Alliance (ISA) to help stop to hunger by supporting Indianapolis' fourth annual Kids Against

Hunger of Central Indiana "Million Meal Marathon."

The event took place at Lucas Oil Stadium and brought more than 4,200 volunteers together to pack nutritious meals that will be distributed through Gleaners, Midwest Food Bank and Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Indiana to help end hunger for the one in four Hoosier children who are food insecure. The meal packets consist of rice, soy, vitamins and dehydrated vegetables.

Colts Cory Redding, spokesperson for the Colts and Indiana Corn and Soybean's "Hoosier Horsepower" program, helped kick off the event by packing meals with FFA students from across the state and the Indiana FFA State Officer Team. "I'm proud to partner with Indiana's corn and soybean farmers to feed hungry kids," said Redding. "I don't think any kid should go to bed hungry. Events like the Million Meal Marathon help us get closer to the goal."

During the two-hour shift, the 200 FFA members helped pack more than 300,000 meals. In addition to supporting the Million Meal Marathon, the goal of the "Hoosier Horsepower" program is to feed enough Indiana children to fill Lucas Oil Stadium (65,000). For every tackle the Colts' defense made during the 2014 season, \$10 was donated to Kids Against Hunger. In addition to packing meals, close to 300 FFA members had the great experience to attend the Indianapolis Colts football game that following Sunday.

INDIANA FFA CONFERENCES

The Indiana FFA is unique in that it is able to provide leadership development conferences for its members multiple times throughout the year. During the conferences, students are able to network with other members from across the state and develop their leadership skills through hands on learning with curriculum developed and presented by the Indiana FFA State Officers.

LDW - Leadership Development Workshop – Sponsored by CSX Transportation and Indiana Farm Bureau

This is a workshop of chapter officers/leaders to help them plan their year and learn about being a leader in their chapter. The conference curriculum is on a three year rotation: Chapter Development (focus on recruitment, retention, and chapter activities/POA), Community Development (focus on community service activities, fundraising, and developing a community image of your chapter), and Student Development (focus on development of the officers in their personal growth and as a team). LDW is a 3 day workshop held in September for those chapters who elect officers by school year and January for chapters who elect by calendar year, though any chapter can come to either conference.

SOAR - Seek Opportunities and Achieving Results – Sponsored by The Anderson's and Helena

This is a conference for students who are beginning their FFA careers (9-10 grade, middle school if they are mature enough) SOAR Curriculum is on a three year rotation: FFA Focus (Opportunities in FFA, CDE's, Defining Success, etc.), SAE Focus (developing strong SAE's, Work ethic, Goal Setting, etc.), and Ag Industry Focus (Opportunities in the agriculture industry, Personal Vision, Beliefs and Values, etc.) SOAR is a 3 day conference held on two separate weekends in October.

FIRE - Foundations In Reaching Excellence - Sponsored by Crop Production Services, MacAllister Agriculture Division and FarmWorld

This conference is for older FFA members (11-12, 10th if they are mature enough). The curriculum is on a two year rotation: Present Excellence Focus (Being a mentor, Setting Goals, Taking leadership to the next step, etc.) and Future Excellence Focus (Life after High School, Advocating for agriculture, Creating a personal vision, etc.). FIRE is a 3 day conference held on two separate weekends in November.

PLT - Premier Leadership Training – Sponsored by CSX Transportation

This workshop is for district officers, section directors and band and chorus officers. PLT is facilitated by the National Officer Candidate and the curriculum is based on their preference, but generally focuses on leadership training, team development and personal growth. PLT is a 2 day conference held at the beginning of September.

Jr. High FFA Day

A one day workshop that gives Jr. High FFA members the opportunity to learn about FFA and experience the FFA Center. Jr. High FFA Day is held in April.

Summer Challenge – Sponsored by Dow Agrosciences

Summer Challenge is truly the only "Camp" offered by the FFA. It is an opportunity for FFA members to have fun with other members around the state enjoying the FFA Center and the outdoor activities that are provided here. Students also learn about personal growth and team building by utilizing the low ropes course, enjoying speakers during the banquet and vespers, and also team sports events. It is a 4 day camp held in July.

INDIANA STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (ISDA) GRANT FOR AG ED & FFA



Indiana State Department of Agriculture grants \$50,000 to support Agriculture Education and the Indiana FFA. The first part of the funding provided seed money to start the Coaching for Beginning Agriculture Teachers or CBAT as we call it, Indiana is very appreciative of the funding of this program that ultimately impacts Indiana's agriculture students. This proved beneficial as we kicked off the program and reached out to veteran agricultural educators across the state to mentor 30 new agriculture teachers throughout Indiana. Our veteran teachers are working with these new teachers on their professional endeavors while, observing them in their classrooms and supporting them through first year issues. This has pushed the support of a new agriculture teacher to a higher level, with hopes of greater teacher retention and better services to our youth in agricultural classes.

Two regional coordinators, Beth Theobald and Charity Keffaber are working to motivate and support both the new teachers and their coaches, especially when half of our new teachers have entered into teaching through non-traditional means. We hope that both will gain experiences that will build them into better agricultural educators. During the coordinators visits, they detect concerns that they can work to solve and thus help the new teacher to transition more easily into the profession. The efforts to facilitate the CBAT program, support agriculture teachers and their programs, and train them as they prepare the next generation of agriculturalists are proving invaluable.

The next area of funding was to help support the 49 Career Development Events (CDE) which cover job skills in everything from communications to mechanics, Indiana FFA members are prepared for the future in a competitive format that motivates members to greater personal growth and leadership development. The value of CDE's to Indiana's future agriculture workforce cannot be overemphasized. The cost involved in facilitating quality CDE events for our members has risen year by year as the Indiana FFA Association has strove to give our members the finest educational experience possible for each CDE, these dollars certainly helped do that.

Our last area of funding was to help support state officer training. These trainings helped them build the confidence in their abilities to deliver a better agriculture message and help them be better leaders within Indiana's youth. Their success translates in more advisors who want their students to be a part of the experiences the state officers provide through conferences, workshops, chapter visits and banquet speeches.

Indiana FFA Association is housed out of ISDA and the Indiana FFA Foundation is very appreciative of the support they provide, this grant is certainly no exception, their leadership and support is greatly valued and we thank them for their continued efforts in our cause to build better leaders and students through FFA and agriculture education.

LILLY ENDOWMENT AWARDS INDIANA FFA FOUNDATION \$25,000




Through this grant, the Indiana FFA Foundation will conduct a needs assessment of its members, alumni, school and community partners to

HAPPENINGS AT THE FFA LEADERSHIP CENTER



We had a great beginning and ending to our year at the Center. We began our year with a \$50,000 grant from Farm Credit Mid-America. This grant was used to purchase new mattresses for the lodge and four of the six cabins. All the windows in the lodge were replaced with new energy efficient windows. A security gate was installed and we purchased new desks and book shelves for each of the lodge rooms. The final use of the grant was to purchase a new commercial carpet cleaner. We stretched the money as far as possible to complete many projects for the Center.

In late winter we initiated the "Piece of the Rock" project to fund a new entry sign at the front of the property. We had over 50 chapters and advisors participate in this project. The end result is a lighted sign with changeable letters erected in a beautiful brick flower bed base. Our clients are very pleased to see their name on the entry sign whenever they arrive for their visit.

This year we expanded our fundraising dinners to every Thursday night. Each dinner features a different main dish. Everyone enjoys the live entertainment as they are dining.

Through the help of grant dollars from the Indiana State Department of Agriculture, the Indiana FFA Foundation put a deposit on getting a fiber-optic line. This new amenity allows us to offer unlimited internet service to any size client. The speed and capacity of our internet has greatly increased our technology offerings. Additional contributions were secured from the Indiana FFA Foundation, Johnson County REMC, NineStar Communications and the financial help of 2-3 anonymous contributors.

The progress at the Center has only been possible with the support of many FFA Advisors, the Center steering committee, FFA Alumni, a dedicated staff and area agribusinesses.

It is hard to find anyone who likes to give their hard earned dollars away. And most people question the return on their investment, when it ends up in the hands of the tax man! This would allow your trustee to sell appreciated assets sheltered in the vehicle without paying capital gains tax. And, if you have several charities that you would like to support, a private family foundation can be established. Advantages of a foundation include retaining family control through multiple generations.

There are many estate planning strategies that can empower your family, impact your community, and perpetuate your values. Prime candidates for these strategies can be anyone who has or will soon have assets that may be subject to capital gains, transfer (estate) taxes, or assets that need long-term preservation or specific use goals. Like any financial planning, proper advice is key to the successful implementation of these planning tools. Consult with a qualified financial planner, CPA, and attorney before making these important decisions.

There are people from all walks of life who are known as legends. Most of them never set out to be one, they just ended up that way. With proper planning, you and your loved ones can leave a living legacy far beyond your lifetime. If you are like me, you believe there are some things that are worth promoting, preserving and protecting. Proper planning can help you achieve it.


