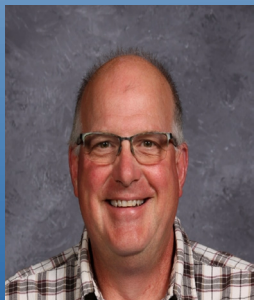

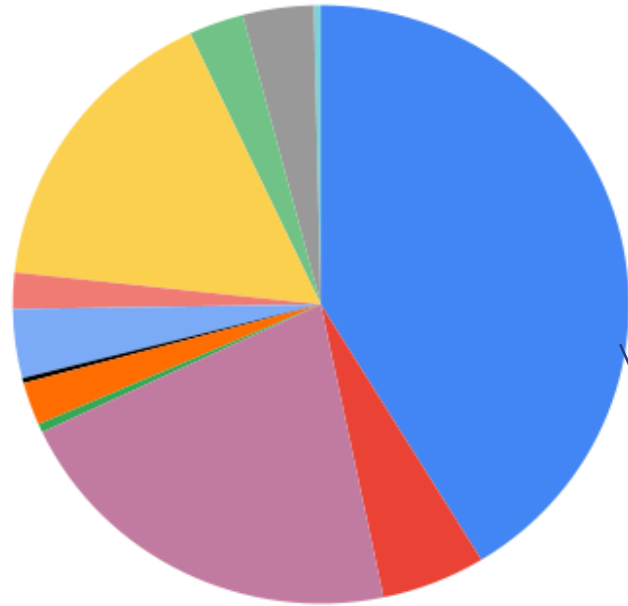

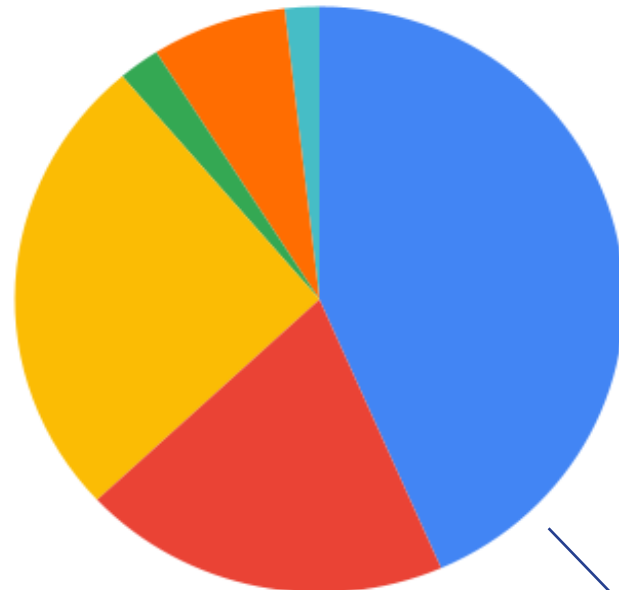

Lilly Endowment Grant Strengthens Agricultural Education and Indiana FFA Over Three Years

The National FFA Foundation and Indiana FFA have successfully completed a three-year initiative supported by Lilly Endowment Inc., aimed at strengthening agricultural education and expanding access for students across Indiana. The 3-million-dollar grant, awarded in 2022, focused on six major areas—teacher professional development, recruitment and retention, curriculum development, capital support, staff capacity, and statewide marketing. Together, these efforts have helped agriculture teachers create more meaningful and inclusive student experiences, especially for learners from underrepresented and marginalized populations. From the early groundwork established in 2023 to the large-scale program growth seen in 2024 and the program refinement and expansion completed in 2025, the grant has had a transformative impact on agricultural education across the state.

Teacher professional development served as a cornerstone of the initiative. Over three years, Indiana agriculture educators benefited from a multi-tiered system of support including university-led workshops, innovative inclusion training through the iDelta program, the Building Bridges inclusion-centered training series, and individualized professional development grants. Demand increased dramatically—growing from 24 recipients in the first year to 34 in the second, and 25 more teachers funded in 2025. Teachers used grants to attend CASE trainings, NAAE conferences, international experiences, agricultural technology workshops, and more. Evaluation results across all three years show strong implementation of new skills in the classroom, improved teacher retention, and increased capacity to engage diverse learners. Teachers reported deeper confidence, more inclusive classroom practices, and renewed excitement for teaching thanks to these opportunities.

The grant also significantly advanced teacher recruitment and retention. The statewide mentorship program, launched in the first year with 27 mentors supporting 32 early-career teachers, expanded each year—growing to 34 mentors and mentees by 2025. Mentors participated in extensive training, reported increased confidence in coaching new teachers, and supported mentees through statewide trainings, classroom visits, and structured communication. The program's growth and strong evaluation outcomes demonstrate meaningful progress in addressing Indiana's agricultural educator shortage and helping new teachers thrive in the profession. In parallel, curriculum development efforts progressed from establishing processes and drafting the new Principles of Agriculture course in Year 1, to completing and preparing it for statewide use in 2024, and finally updating and refining it in 2025 in alignment with Ivy Tech Community College's requirements.

Capital support investments across the three years provided immediate and long-term improvements for both local agriculture classrooms and the Indiana FFA Leadership Center. Starting with 13 classroom enhancement grants in 2023, the program expanded to 35 grants in the second year and 34 grants in the third—funding essential equipment upgrades, welding and electrical improvements, technology enhancements, outdoor learning spaces, and more. Teachers consistently reported that these upgrades significantly improved student engagement, hands-on learning, and program inclusivity. Meanwhile, the Indiana FFA Leadership Center advanced ADA accessibility planning and began construction on updated facilities to ensure all students can fully participate in leadership camps and chapter retreats. Additional chapter participation grants allowed hundreds of students—many from underserved populations—to engage in inclusive leadership development experiences at the Center.

Across all three years, expanded staff capacity from National FFA and a comprehensive marketing and communications effort, including the creation of the Grow with Us platform and statewide recruitment materials, ensured that resources, curriculum, and professional development opportunities reached teachers effectively. By transitioning platform ownership to Indiana FFA in 2025, the project set the stage for long-term sustainability. Thanks to Lilly Endowment Inc.'s generous support, Indiana agriculture educators and FFA members now benefit from stronger programs, modernized learning environments, improved curriculum, and a more inclusive framework for agricultural education. The three-year partnership between National FFA and Indiana FFA has built systems that will continue empowering teachers and students for years to come.

This year, the Indiana FFA Foundation proudly celebrates the completion of the newly revised **Advanced Life Science (ALS): Animals** curriculum—made possible through the generous support of the **Indiana Soybean Alliance**, the **Spriestersbach Farm Corporation Educational Agricultural Grant**, and **Rose Acre Farms**. Their investments ensured that one of Indiana’s most important agricultural education resources is now fully modernized and ready for classroom use across the state.

Originally introduced in 2005 through a partnership between Indiana Team AGED and CAERT, Inc. (now Cutting Edge Curriculum, Inc.), the ALS curricula—Animals, Plants, and Foods—have long helped prepare Indiana students for careers in agricultural sciences. These courses have opened doors through dual credit opportunities, strengthened high school career pathways, and inspired countless students to explore advanced agricultural and biological concepts. As agriculture and science rapidly evolved over the past 15 years, the need to update the ALS: Animals curriculum became essential. Thanks to our committed partners, the newly completed revision delivers a stronger, more relevant, and inquiry-driven experience for today’s learners.

The updated curriculum is built around the **5E inquiry model—Engage, Explore, Explain, Elaborate, and Evaluate**—encouraging deeper student investigation and more meaningful connections to real-world agricultural challenges. Each lesson aligns with key educational benchmarks, including:

- **Indiana State Standards**
- **National AFNR Standards**
- **NGSS Performance Expectations**
- **Common Core State Standards**

These alignments ensure that the curriculum remains academically rigorous, accessible to both agriculture and science educators, and reflective of modern industry expectations. Cutting Edge Curriculum, Inc. led the development process, working closely with Ivy Tech-Columbus to ensure dual-credit alignment and collaborating with the Indiana Office of Higher Education/CTE to match the newly approved ALS competencies under the Next Level Pathways. Their work ensures that students continue to receive high-quality instruction that meets both state and post-secondary requirements.

With curriculum writing, review, and final editing now complete, teachers across Indiana are equipped with a refreshed ALS: Animals resource that reflects current advancements in genetics, sustainability, precision agriculture, and today’s best instructional practices.

We extend our deepest gratitude to the Indiana Soybean Alliance, Spriestersbach Farm Corporation, and Rose Acre Farms for their vision and commitment. Their support has strengthened agricultural education statewide and helped ensure that Indiana’s next generation of agricultural leaders is prepared for the challenges and opportunities ahead.

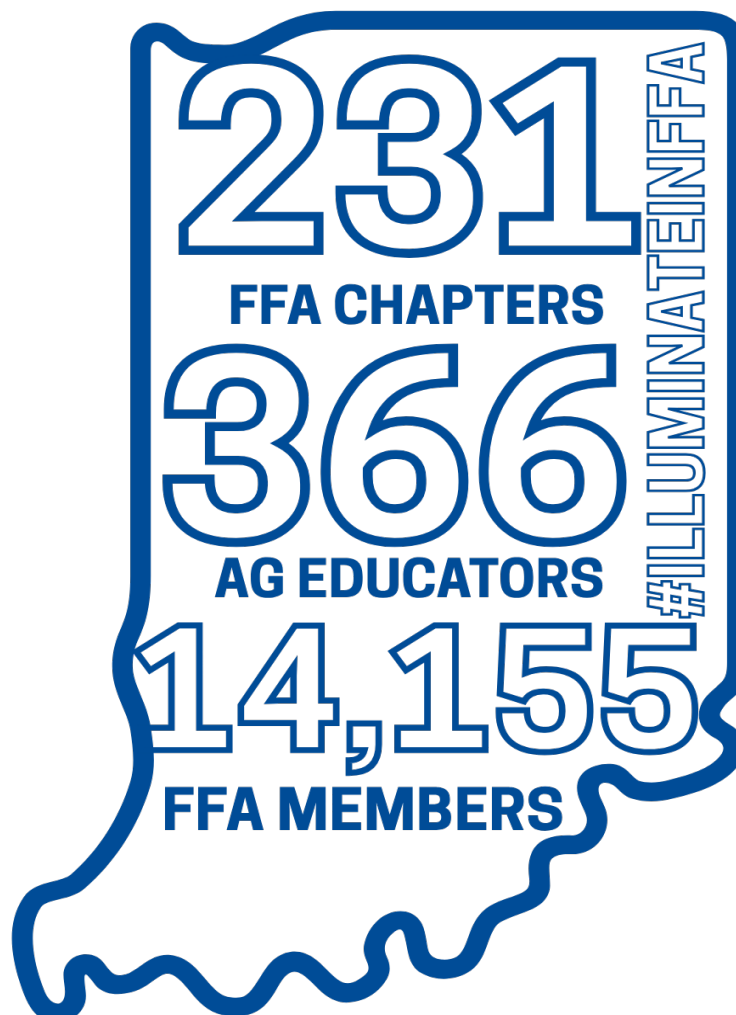

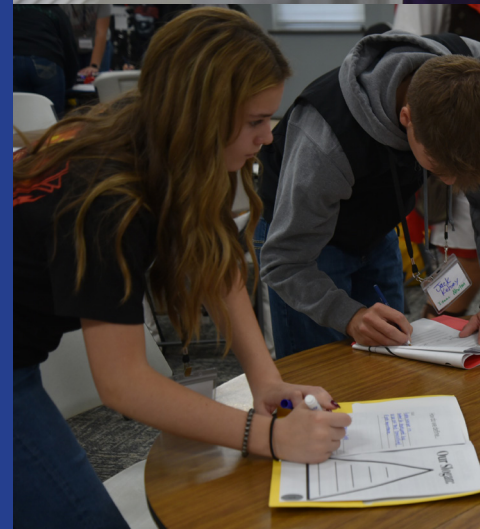

Indiana FFA Foundation Awarded Grant to Develop Energy Alternatives Curriculum

The Indiana FFA Foundation received a grant from the Indiana Office of Energy Development to create new instructional materials for the Energy Alternatives course—an important resource supporting the Indiana Next Level Program of Study (NLPS) in Sustainable Energy. The project was coordinated by the Indiana FFA Foundation and developed by Cutting Edge Curriculum, Inc.

The new curriculum helps Indiana agricultural science teachers introduce students to key energy topics, including renewable energy, solar and wind technologies, geothermal and biomass systems, nuclear energy, and careers across the energy sector. All content is written by educators for educators, ensuring objective, clear, and classroom-ready materials.

Each lesson follows the inquiry-based 5E model (Engage, Explore, Explain, Elaborate, Evaluate) and includes hands-on activities that encourage student investigation and real-world problem-solving. Lessons are carefully aligned to Indiana Content Standards and Competencies, National AFNR Standards, NGSS Performance Expectations, and CEWD Energy and Natural Resources Standards.

The instructional package includes Lesson Plans using the 5E format, E-Units, student-friendly digital textbook sections with vocabulary support and career connections, and PowerPoint presentations for teachers to reinforce key concepts. Formative and summative assessments are incorporated throughout to measure student understanding and progress.

These new resources are now available to Indiana agricultural educators through the Indiana FFA website portal, supporting high-quality energy education across the state and helping prepare students for future careers in the growing energy industry.
